



Law and Development and SDGs in Asian Context Program Tokyo 2019  
Study Program

### 1. Overview

The world is facing many global-scale challenges, such as food shortage, bad sanitary, environmental issues, gender inequality, economic gaps between developing countries and developed countries, and so on. Since the UN launched Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), all countries have been starting projects to achieve these goals.

As you know, SDGs and targets are not one country issues but are related to the regions and the entire world. We need to cooperate with other countries for achievements. For those reasons, knowing other countries' SDGs situations are indispensable, and it can be the first step for discussion about finding a better solution toward SDGs.

In this study program, Keio University Law School (KLS) invites 12 students from our partner universities in Mekong Region Countries.

Participants will discuss current challenges to SDGs in their home countries, and how we can find a better solution and tackle with goals together.

This program is divided into two-part. First is a small round table discussion with participants. Second is a presentation in the symposium. Participants invite "Collaborated Programs for International Cooperation in Legal Field 2019 Symposium on Legal Cooperation", and have opportunities for presentation. KLS annually holds the symposium with Ministry of Justice of Japan and Nagoya University. Every year, lawyers, judges, prosecutors, private companies' workers, Japan International Cooperate Agency (JICA) staffs and people who are interested in legal cooperation join the event and give feedback to presenters. 2019 is the 11th anniversary of the symposium.

We are looking forward to the application from students.

#### 4. Student' s eligibility

- (1) Currently enrolled undergraduate (3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup>) or graduate school.
- (2) Advanced or fluent speaker of English.
- (3) Good team communication with new people.

#### 5. Application and Selection

- Applicants should prepare **CV, motivation letter and transcript.**
- English score (TOEFL, IELTS and TOEIC) is not compulsory, however, if you have good score, please submit it. We positively evaluate your English ability.
- If applicants were participant of the **Hanoi Summer School 2019** which is co-organized by KLS and Hanoi Law University, please attach certification. We positively evaluate their eligibility.

- Your home institution nominates **2 (two)** candidates to KLS. KLS accepts candidates.

If applicants joined the **Hanoi Summer School 2019**, please consider their participation for your nomination. KLS has already highly evaluated their communication skill, presentation skills and case analysis as well as their English ability.

#### 6. Travel Support

KLS will support nominated student' s **airfare fees (round-trip, your home country to Tokyo)** and **accommodations fees.** Other expenses such as meal, travel insurance, transportation fees in Tokyo should be owned by participants.
