2. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is intended to provide students with proper understanding of legal English. Students will, first, be grounded with characteristics of legal English in order to derive full insights into its distinction from ordinary English and also into its peculiarity to the legal profession. This will, next, be followed by a seminal session dedicated to practising writing legal English, whereby students will be given demonstration of how to write legally related texts, composition of which requires skillful legal phraseology, with certain legalese (where necessary). Further, fundamental legal terminologies and expressions as used in the legal scholarship and profession in different areas of law, with emphasis on legal terminologies and expressions in contract law and the law of torts, will be introduced, with a view to building up students' proper understanding of how to use them in proper legal contexts. In this connection, exercises on the use of legal terminologies will be given as an efficient means to assess students' correct comprehension. Moreover, this course provides a practical forum for giving students an insightful account of academic writing in the legal profession. Finally, students will be trained to undertake analytical reading whereby skimming and scanning techniques will be shown for the purpose of reading legal writings including judicial decisions.

3. COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To bring to light distinct characteristics of legal English and legal writing;
- To provide a practical forum for practising legal writing;
- To introduce fundamental legal terminologies and expressions as used in different areas of law, with emphasis on legal terminologies and expressions in contract law and the law of torts;
- To give students, through well-designed exercises, practice on the usage of legal terminologies and expressions;

- To provide insightful guidance on how to produce good and impressive academic writings in the legal profession;
- To take students through skimming and scanning techniques in the process of reading legal writings
